

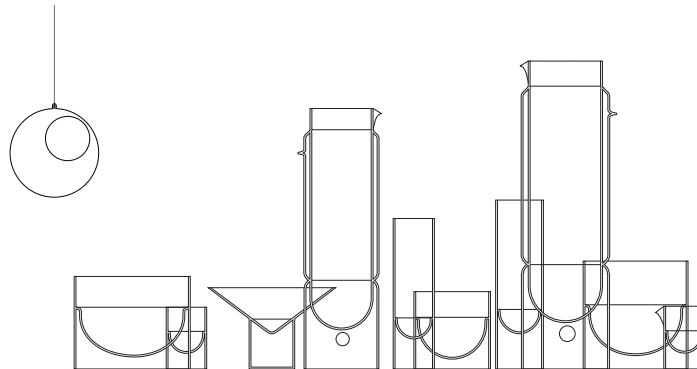

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float is a line of thermally resistant glassware with simple forms and clean lines that emphasize the expressive colours and charm of the tea, spirits and other liquids within.

The glassware is handcrafted by master glassblowers in the Czech Republic from the finest borosilicate glass, an extremely pure and chemically inert material that is resistant to thermal shock. This allows float to be used safely with boiling hot or icy cold liquids.

The suspended bowl creates a lens of liquid colour, projecting hues of light onto the table below, and insulates your hands from your beverage. When used for a chilled drink, beads of condensation will gather on the underbelly of the bowl, adding delicacy to the optical effect rather than creating rings on the tabletop.

float tea lantern, the collection's signature piece, is a tea pot named for the quality of light transmitted through the tea by the warming candle. The lantern is made with a double glass wall, enclosing a vacuum, to provide thermal insulation. The insulated wall allows for the simple form of a cylinder without a handle—simply hold and pour the way you would a wine bottle.

float glassware carries a cohesive design language across a range of sizes, creating visual continuity from water to tea to cocktail.



The suspended bowl design emphasizes not only the colour of the liquid within, but also the wonderful movement and activity as ingredients are added or stirred.



The collection provides a considered place for every element of the ritual, such as sugar, cream, and honey.

A candle placed below tea lantern keeps tea gently warm while creating a cylinder of coloured, ambient light.



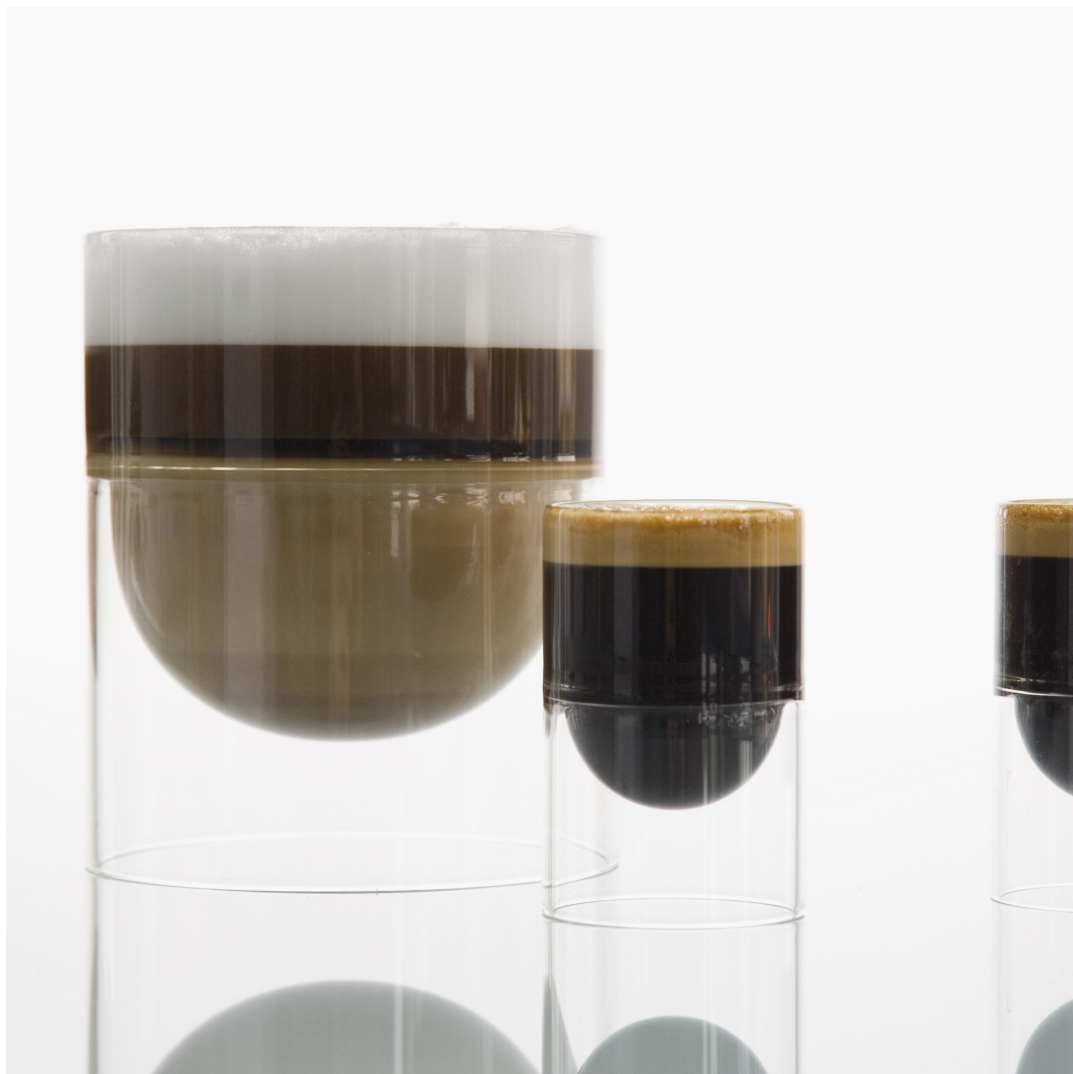
The inert quality of borosilicate glass allows for a clean, refreshing infusion. Preserving the purity of delicate flavours, the lantern is ideal for an overnight cold steep tea or to make flash brew coffee.



The suspended bowl design allows you to hold float at the upper section to gently warm your hands, or grasp the lower portion for a comfortable insulated area.

The clean lines and a simple form of glasses highlights the colour of its contents. This versatile 7.5 fluid ounce (220 ml) vessel perfectly suits cappuccinos and desserts, or gives red wine space to breathe.



A modern take on the classic champagne flute, this slender form offers a fresh perspective on a time-honoured tradition. It is equally suited for liqueurs, ice wines, or to showcase the delicacy of a single flower.



Borosilicate glass is resistant to thermal shock, making it safe for use in the oven or with a crème brûlée torch.

The collection can also serve as a contemporary collection of pots. Orchids and other plants that photosynthesize through their roots excel in float.



The float collection has grown to include a series of generously proportioned vessels that continue to share the same visual language inherent to the original collection.

float large deep bowl doubles as a generous serving bowl or a planter for larger orchids or herbaceous perennials.



With its generous width, float shallow bowl encapsulates the poetic sensibilities of the collection, conjuring images of reflecting pools and creating a captivating sense of weightlessness.

The shallow bowl is particularly well-suited for decorating and enlivening a coffee or dining table.

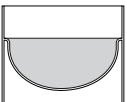


Inspired by the Finnish tradition of illuminating Christmas trees with burning candles, float bubble has two openings — a larger one to place a floating candle, and a small hole that provides airflow for the flame. Made in clear or translucent glass it can be hung on a tree, in a window or as a grouping to create a chandelier.
